Draft parking policy

The Metro Parking Policy 2024 aims to establish a park-and-ride system by identifying stations that meet the demand, and prioritises the usage of these spaces exclusively for metro riders.

The policy sets structured parking fees, monitors compliance and incorporates technology for efficient management. It also explores the possibility of increasing parking capacity.
